CALL TO ORDER:

President Benish called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. Members present: Jed Benish, Colleen Cruise, Kevin Henke and Rob Rushman. Members absent: Cary Linton and Jennifer Powell. Also present were Superintendent Lorrie Miller, Principal Lance Howitt and Recording Secretary Janella Kruse. In addition, there were two visitors.

Moved by Mr. Rushman, seconded by Mr. Henke to approve the agenda. Motion approved 4-0.

BUSINESS MEETING:

Moved by Mr. Benish, seconded by Mrs. Cruise to approve the minutes of the Board's regular meeting for July 10, 2017. Motion approved 4-0.

Moved by Mr. Rushman, seconded by Mrs. Cruise to approve General Fund bills and financial reports as presented. Motion approved 4-0.

Moved by Mrs. Cruise, seconded by Mr. Rushman to approve bills and financial reports from the remaining funds as presented. Motion approved 4-0.

Moved by Mr. Benish, seconded by Mr. Rushman to approve a quote for a cold food bar at the elementary site. Motion approved 4-0.

Moved by Mr. Benish, seconded by Mrs. Cruise to approve the disposal of out dated and broken technology equipment. Motion approved 4-0.

Moved by Mr. Benish, seconded by Mr. Henke to adopt the Hazard Mitigation Plan as presented. Motion approved 4-0.

Moved by Mr. Benish, seconded by Mrs. Cruise to approve the new teacher evaluation form, to revise Policy #4030 (Evaluation of Certificated Employees) and to review Policy #4031 (Evaluation of Probationary Certificated Employees). Motion approved 4-0.

REPORTS:

Mr. Rushman, representing the Americanism committee, reviewed our policy regarding weapon protocol for the American Legion Color Guard. President Benish, representing the Wellness committee, addressed concerns on the smart snacks guidelines and wellness policy. Discussion and possible action was tabled until the September meeting. The Buildings & Grounds committee reviewed the progress on the remaining summer projects. Moved by Mr. Rushman, seconded by Mrs. Cruise to contract out the remaining trim work at the high school. Motion approved 4-0.

Mr. Howitt reported on the schedule for teacher in-service days, activities for the eclipse viewing day, NSAA fall enrollment and assigned sub-districts. KSB Law Firm will conduct a digital citizenship training on August 23rd at 6:30 p.m. The annual tailgate party will begin at 3:00 p.m. on August 24th with the football game starting at 5:00 p.m. There will be no admission charge that evening. MAP testing will begin the week of August 28th for K-11th grade students. There will be a meeting of administrators, law enforcement officers, probation officers, and welfare case workers on August 29th to establish a working relationship. The K-8th grade students will attend the Harlem Ambassadors assembly in Bridgeport on September 7th.

Ms. Miller reported on new classified staff: Brenda Ahlm (Kitchen Aide-Gurley); Rhonda Rummel (Kitchen Aide-Dalton); and Bill Wilber (HS Boys' Basketball Coach). She also reported on the HAL (High Ability Learners) program and fundraising plans for the extra-curricular organizations.



News from the Superintendent

This school year started with a lot of excitement. New start times, facility upgrades, two days of teacher and staff training, the solar eclipse, high school computer dissemination, and our tailgate party gave everyone very full schedules. We all look forward to a regular routine. Will September bring a regular routine? Only until we disrupt the schedule again with MAP testing.

Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) are a series of computerized tests that we will give to students in grades K-11 beginning August 28. The tests are over reading, language usage, math, and science. The scores tell teachers what students need to know, and the teachers then adjust their lesson plans accordingly.

Three school district goals have been set for the next five years. These goals are 1) to improve students' reading skills, 2) to improve students' math skills, and 3) to enhance the unification and collaboration between the Dalton and Gurley campuses. Action Plans will soon be written by staff members to assure that we meet these goals. An unofficial goal is to increase school spirit. Teachers have created a slogan, "The Warrior Way," and the acronym WARRIORS to not only give a common cheer, but also to guide students in ideal behavior. The acronym stands for We Are Respectful, Responsible, Inspired, Organized, Ready, Safe.

All teachers will be working on one of four committees this year to accomplish the goals described above, and to assist with changes in policies and procedures. The School Improvement Committee will coordinate Action Plans and keep an updated School District Profile available on our website. The Technology Committee is responsible for the dissemination and maintenance of the student device rentals. This committee will also write a five-year plan of technology purchases and training to keep the district budget stable and consistent. The Safety and Security Committee is completing a self-assessment of our situation according to state standards. These committee members will attend trainings and lead discussions with all staff to help us improve our preparedness for emergencies. The Wellness Committee will help communicate state regulations and school policy regarding healthy lifestyles for students. At this time, there is discord between state nutrition mandates and current practices; we need to find a feasible balance.

Teachers will be evaluated this year with a new process. Principal Lance Howitt and teachers have agreed on an evaluation form that will not only evaluate teachers but also help them become better teachers. Part of the evaluation requires teachers to set Student Learning Objectives, such as, "90% of the 6th grade class will score at the 50th percentile or higher on the MAP reading test," or "All welding students will demonstrate 5 acceptable flat fillet welds." The objectives will be set this month, and at the end of the school year, teachers will analyze how well they met their objectives. The results will be stated in each teacher's job evaluation.

All teachers are documenting their curriculum, and two documents are being created. The Course Description Book will be available to students and parents; this will help high school

students understand graduation requirements and assist in making decisions about elective courses. Curriculum Maps will show K-12 lessons planned for each month of the school year. This will be helpful when parents want to know what their child is learning at any given time of the school year. It will also be helpful when students transfer to our district and need to jump into a course where they left off.

EZMessaging will be used this year to inform parents of emergencies, changes in schedules, and upcoming events. Parents' home phone numbers are registered into a computerized telephone calling system. When a pre-recorded message goes out, all parents will receive a call. When each parent answers the phone, the message will be played. Please make sure we have your updated home telephone number.

I want to publically thank Shad and Michelle Benish for their donation of beef for our hot lunch program. The Benish family donated a previously bottle-fed cow weighing over 800 pounds and named Chip. I also want to thank KDK Meats in Bridgeport for donating the supplies necessary for the processing of the meat. Students will enjoy prime beef in their school lunches this month.

Another "Thank You" goes to Taylor Borges, Senior Class President, who leads high school students in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance every day over the building intercom. Taylor also reads the daily announcements, keeping everyone at the high school informed.

In visiting various classrooms these first 2 weeks, I have been impressed with what I have seen. I would like to share some of my significant and funny observations as follow:

- 2nd graders danced like penguins during a 3-minute exercise break between writing assignments...Thank you, Mrs. Staudenmaier.
- A boy named Dillon bravely announced his nickname, Dill Pickle...Thank you, Mrs. Pelster.
- High school students said, "Please" and "Thank you" in the lunch line...Thanks, Students.
- Even though high school seniors were disappointed that I deleted Teacher Aide periods, they enrolled in interesting courses without whining...Thank you, Seniors.
- Excellent teaching strategies (the Home Alone scream hands) were used to get choir students to project their voices...Thank you, Mr. Oakes.
- Wonderful science labs were prepared for the eclipse viewing...Thank you, Mr. Henderson!
- Awesome digital photos were taken of the sun and moon at the eclipse viewing...Thank you, Mrs. Schumacher.
- High school students led cheers just before the eclipse trash sweep on the pasture grounds...Thanks, Cheerleaders.

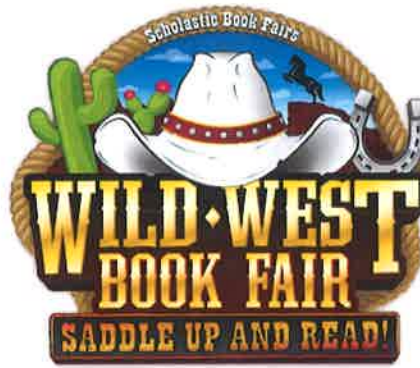

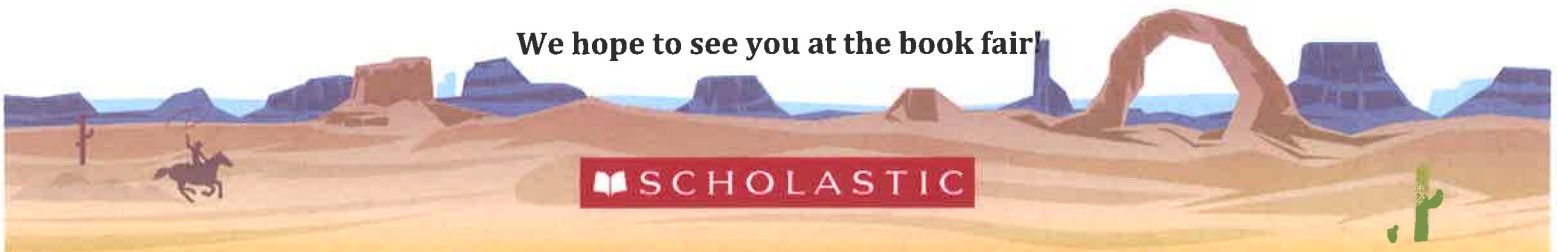
