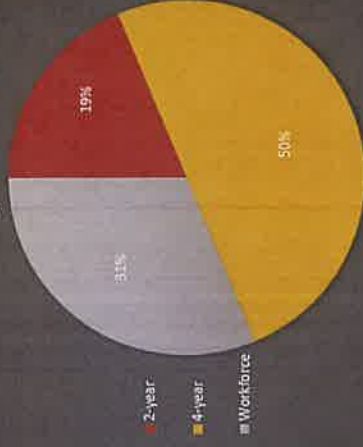

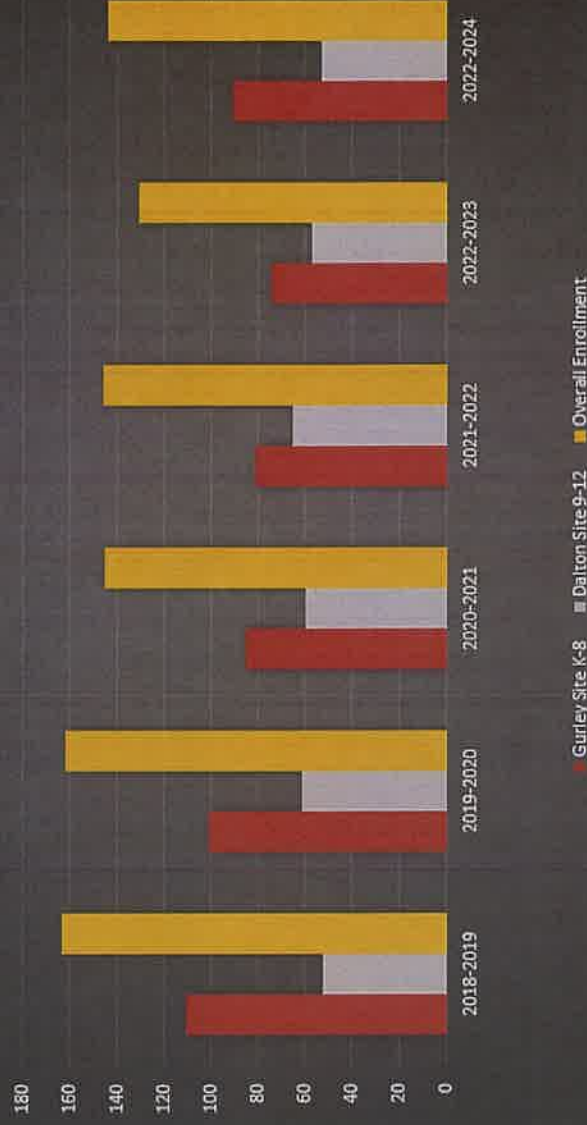

## Enrollment Trends



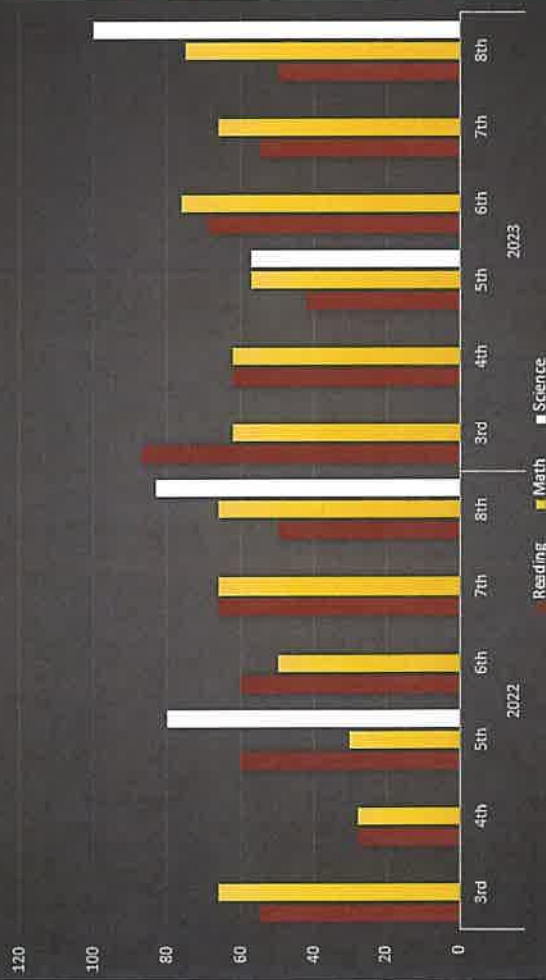


# Academic Achievement

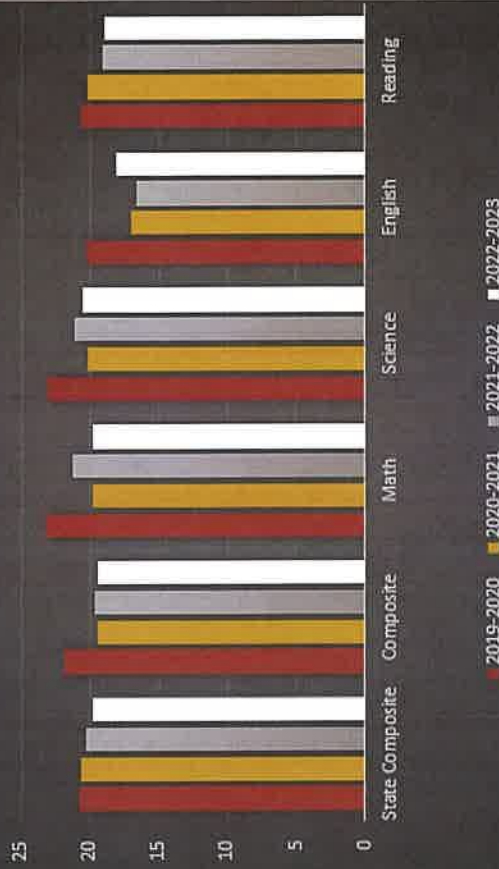
NSCAS Results Percent Proficient

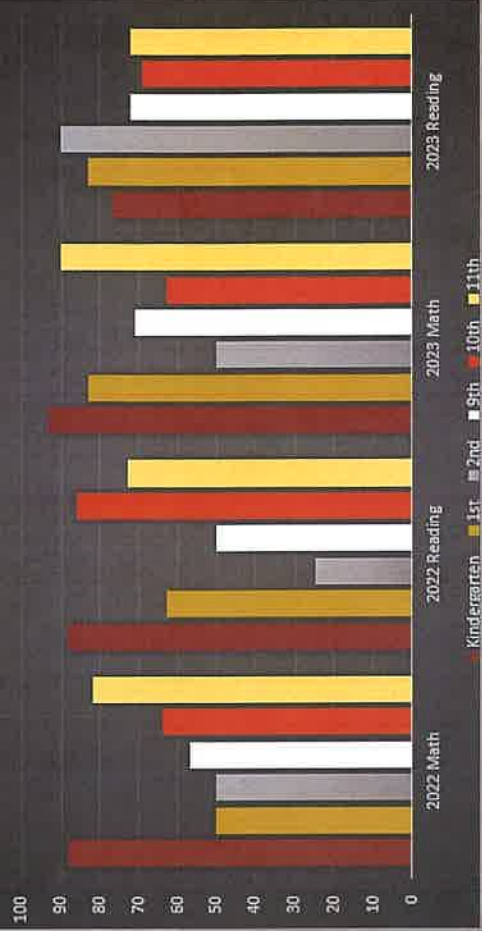

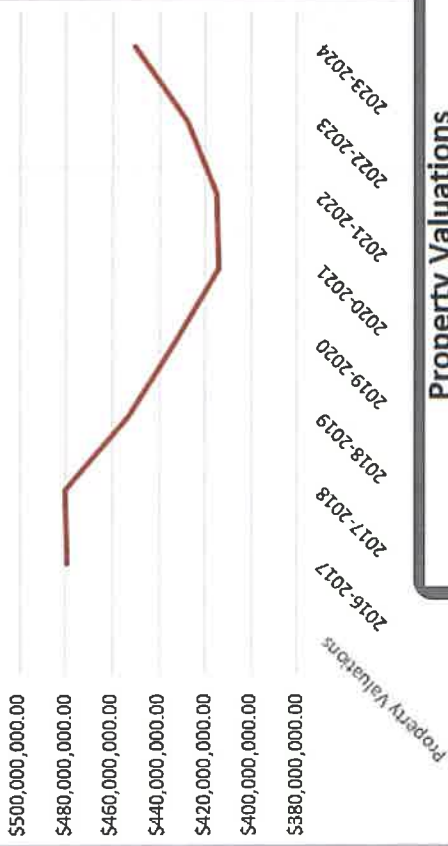

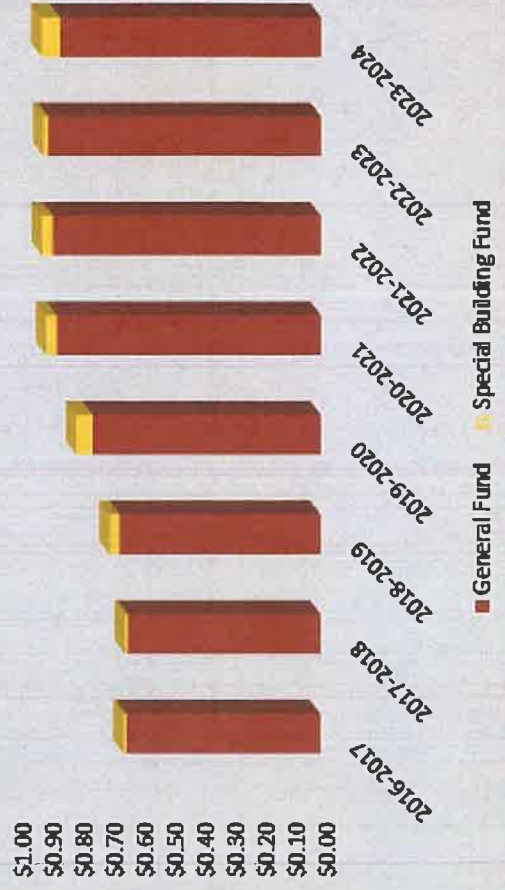

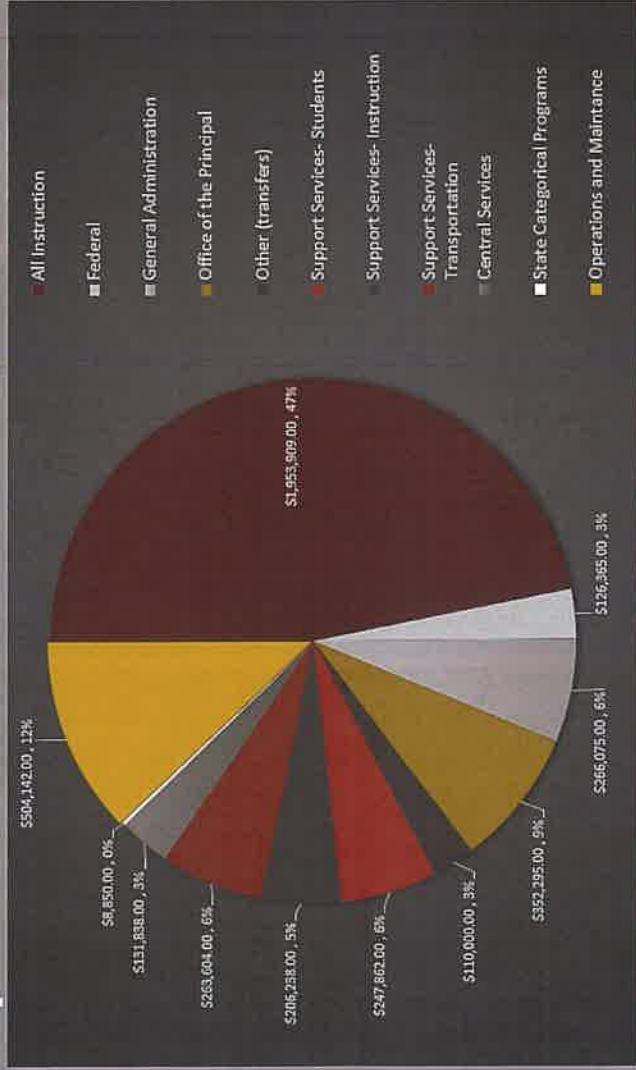
