#### A note from the Superintendent:

I hope this message finds you well and your families are adjusting well to the start of another wonderful school year. I rarely use this newsletter as a soapbox (maybe I should) but this month's message will be around the concept of the school budget and how we at Leyton Public Schools go about reflecting, developing, and ultimately presenting the budget for approval at our School Board Meeting. After reading this message I sure would love to hear from people about their thoughts on our process and ultimately what gets passed.

For the past three budget cycles, I've told the Board of Education that our school budget is a driving force toward carrying out the vision and mission of Leyton Public Schools. It's an opportunity to share with the community our hopes and dreams for the future of our school. We have worked hard to keep our community at the center of all decisions we make at our school. This year the budget development cycle was complicated and took a lot of patience and time as Governor Pillen's Special Session forced us into a waiting game to see what would happen with school finance. Frankly, the message that's out there right now is that "schools are spending too much money". I want to address those concerns explicitly in this newsletter and hope that any concerns you have after reading this will be addressed.

Every year around this time my budget committee has directed me to provide them with the line item budget for our school, along with historical information on the Levy, Valuations, state aid, and tax asking. Each component that that board requests goes a long way in telling the story of how we get to the final tax asking for the coming year. Like many schools across the state, Leyton spends approximately 80 percent of our budget each year on the teachers, paraprofessionals, office staff, bus drivers, custodians, and other staffing needs. I'm very proud of the men and women who work for Leyton, we are a very great district to work for and be a part of. In today's climate of teacher shortages, we have somehow weathered that storm for the most part and have been able to fill our teaching slots. We have opportunities for students to graduate from Leyton with skills to go on to do what they want to do in life and dream big. The seniors from my first year are already ¼ of the way through college and have done well in that transition. We have students attending trade schools, and working directly in the workforce too, Leyton Public Schools is where it all started and we want to keep our incredible staff at Leyton.


The school board is holding a community budget meeting on September 3, 2024 at 6:00 PM in the High School Library. This will be an opportunity for the community to come in and hear about the budget and update the community and board on the current state of our school's finances. I invite community members to attend and take part in the meeting so that we can present more information on the hopes and dreams of our district, and how we get there this next year. I'll present information on historical items like district spending, the levy, valuations, enrollment, and state aid through the years. All of these factors go into creating a budget that meets the needs of our students at the same time staying fully aware of the responsibilities we have to use taxpayer's money appropriately. I hope our taxpayers see Leyton as a place where the future is bright, and continue that tradition of excellence for years to come. 


