A note from the Superintendent,

I hope this message finds you well and Fall is finally upon us, now I can officially begin complaining about it being too cold (joking). I've had a lot of opportunities to watch Agriculture in action out my front window in Gurley, as many of our community members are adding to what I'm affectionately calling "Corn Mountain". It's been amazing to see how much corn is harvested from our area and I wish our farming families all the best as they are working their way through this season. That being said I thought I'd use this month's newsletter to talk about the changing of the seasons around Leyton.


The first item I wanted to address is the concept of school closures and how we make those decisions. Picture yourself as a parent of a new driver the first time it snows... most of my decisions come down to that concept. I also utilize a team of country road drivers from all over the area, Sam goes out to Dalton, Shad and Charles hit the west side of Dalton, Rol and I take some Gurley roads, and Jed also helps gauge the roads around the school. We think that helps make an easier call in the event of a school closure. The faster I know about road conditions the earlier I will call off school for a snow day. Mr. Jones or I will use the student information system JMC to make an all-call to call off school. If you are not on the list of people to call or would like to be on the list, please contact the office and we will get you added. We will also advertise on our website, KSID's website, and KNEB's website as well as Facebook to make sure people get the communication.

Our Elementary staff has a rule to "get kids outside" as much as possible during the cold season. We will be going outside until Accuweather says 10 degrees, as it is important for our kids to get fresh air and exercise daily. Please make sure you are thinking about appropriate clothing as fall and winter get here. We need all families to be aware of coats, boots, gloves, and hats during the winter. I know it seems obvious but please be aware we will be outside as much as possible.

Cold and Flu season is also something that we prepare for quite often at the school and we need your help. Our staff all have air filters in their rooms that are supposed to keep our air clean. We replace rooftop filters and keep our facilities clean, but we need support from families in the area of staying home when sick. I can remember one-day last year when we had over 20 students out of the Elementary School in one day, some of that could be due to students coming into school sick. Please follow the school rule of not sending your students to school until 24 hours after they are fever-free without medication.

Safety is the number one priority for our school, we will keep our sidewalks clear of ice, but please be on the lookout for ice especially on the North sides of both buildings, as those areas can turn slick quickly. We have installed new lighting at Dalton especially for evening activities so people can see better and navigate to their vehicles more easily. If you have any suggestions that are not in this month's newsletter please feel free to reach out. Stay safe!

A LOOK AHEAD

This month, our classroom is rolling into an exciting study of wheels!

As we observe children during play, we've noticed they are naturally drawn to objects that move, turn, and roll. From wooden trains to fast toy cars, children enjoy exploring wheels and watching them go! It's a perfect opportunity to dive into learning across various subjects, all while keeping play at the center of our activities.

Through our wheels study, children will explore and develop essential skills in:

- Language and Literacy: We'll expand vocabulary related to movement, shapes, and vehicles, as well as engage in storytelling about where wheels can take us.
- Math: Children will count wheels, compare sizes, and measure distances. We'll also explore patterns and shapes related to circles and rotation.
- Science: We'll investigate how wheels work, what makes them move, and why some wheels go faster than others. The children will also explore different materials and surfaces to see how they affect movement.
- Social Studies: We'll talk about how wheels are used in the community—buses, bikes, and delivery trucks—and how they help people get things done.
- The Arts: Children will create wheel-inspired art, from painting with round objects to designing their own imaginative vehicles.
- Technology: We'll use simple machines and explore how technology uses wheels in daily life.


During our study, we'll also focus on thinking skills by:




WELCOME TO THE 2024-2025 SCHOOL YEAR!!
