Happy New Year, Leyton Families!

As we return from the winter break, I find myself reflecting on an incredibly successful first semester. It is no secret that schools everywhere face challenges, and we are no exception. However, what sets Leyton apart is how our students and staff handle those challenges—with grit, heart, and a commitment to excellence.

Our students at both sites have been nothing short of amazing. They have shown up every day ready to build upon the traditions and high standards that Leyton is known for. I want to take a moment to celebrate the people and programs that made this semester so successful.

Early Childhood: A Foundation for the Future

Our preschool program is a vital resource for our community, and the results are showing. Last year we served 18 students, and this year we have remained strong with as many as 16 young learners. This consistent enrollment tells us we are filling a crucial need for Leyton families.

I want to specifically recognize **Angie Borgmann** and her dedicated staff. Our program has undergone several state evaluations, and each time, we receive better and better results. These scores prove our program is working exactly as designed—preparing our 3- and 4-year-olds for a lifetime of learning.

The Elementary Engine: K–5 Excellence

Our **K–2 Team (Mrs. Kessler, Mrs. Fesmire, and Ms. Larsen)** has done an incredible job preparing our youngest Warriors. Their focus on quality lesson planning and intentional interventions ensures that our students are ready for the increasing demands of school as they progress.

Supporting this effort is **Mrs. Rathman**, who is an incredible asset to our district. She leads our student interventions with such precision that our team operates like a well-oiled machine. This year, the pairing of high-quality instruction with targeted intervention has truly come alive.

In **Grades 3–5, Mrs. Murray, Mrs. Schumacher, and Mrs. Roelle** continue to challenge our students toward greatness. Their ability to keep students engaged in a rigorous curriculum while keeping them genuinely excited about their work is unbelievable. Our elementary school is great because of the people who show up for our kids every day.

Mrs. Bellendir and Mrs. Victory are the Special Education department at our school, and they work with our students each day to provide the appropriate support of a very diverse student body. Their work with our families is strategic and purposeful, and they take our students who need support and design programs for them to be successful and grow.

Middle School: High Expectations, High Growth

At the middle school level, **Ms. McDaniel, Mr. Michelman, and Mr. Newkirk** represent some of the finest team members I have ever worked with. They balance deep care for their students with a high level of accountability. This "tough-but-fair" approach is paying off; our assessment scores continue to show significant growth, proving that our students are rising to meet the high expectations we set for them.

Spotlight on Specials: Creativity and Talent

We are also home to some of the finest "specials" staff in the state.

- **Mr. Oakes** continues to produce incredible concerts. His true gift, however, is his ability to showcase the individual effort and heart each student puts into their music.
- **Mrs. Hansen** is always "cooking up" creative and complex art projects that allow our students to express themselves in new ways.
- **Ms. Deblois** rounds out this team by challenging our students in exciting ways every year.

High School Staff:

The staff at the High school has a huge job to accomplish in the four years they have students. Our general education teachers **Mr. Lipska** (Social Studies), **Mr. Hutton** (Math), **Ms. Hanks** (English), and **Mr. Henderson** (Science), are working with our students each day with meaningful projects and lessons aimed at sparking our student's curiosity as well as preparing them for the next steps in their education whether that means college, military service or entering the workforce. These teachers care about the success of our students and that's the reason we have had a lot of successful students all over the region completing post-secondary education with a high degree of success. Our Career and Technical Education teachers, **Mr. Haley** (Shop), **Mrs. Haupt** (Business) and **Ms. Van Anne** (AG) are incredibly flexible in their approach toward career exploration. This year we have added a lot of exciting things for our students to discover and potentially open their minds to realistic possibilities after high school. We are providing hands-on work across these areas like in the shop with new equipment, and our business class has recently begun the process of adopting a new curriculum that helps our students work with real-world applications and experiences. We have a great group of coaches both in house and in our community, they deserve tons of praise for our student athletes being prepared and competing, not just winning games but teaching life skills along the way.

Support Staff

None of this is possible without an incredible support staff. From our office Secretaries **Mrs. Weiser** and **Mrs. Rushman**, welcoming the students each day, to our custodians who help keep our buildings safe and clean (**Mr. Ernest, Mr. Noel, and Mr. Carley**). **Mrs. Haley** does so much for our students in terms of technology, sponsoring classes, and concessions as well. Our paras at Gurley do an incredible job supporting our students as well as teachers. **Mrs. Van Anne, Mrs. Rhodes** and **Ms. Williamson** work in our preschool. **Mrs. Houshouer, Mrs. Gotfrey, Mrs. Reilly, and Mrs. O'Connell** work in the K-12 classrooms. Janella, can't forget **Janella Kruse**, she keeps the ship moving on the business side (and countless other ways).

Looking Ahead

I mentioned a lot of people in this newsletter, but there are so many more people who impact our district, like our cooks, drivers, Board of Education, and administrators. We have a dedicated staff who cares for our students and are proud to do what they can to make a difference here at Leyton. I'm very proud to call this place home, and this next semester will be another big move in the right direction for Leyton because of all our people.



Students must take at least ½ cup fruit or vegetable on their tray. Unlimited fruit and vegetables are offered daily. Flavored skim and 1% white milk is offered daily. An assortment of fresh and canned fruit are available every morning as well as fruit juice up to twice a week with breakfast. The school district provides a food service program that is designed to provide adequate nutrition and an educational experience for students.
